




INSTRUCTIONS




1. String TIPP + R15A + TRUE2 + R15A repeatedly, until you have a long enough sequence for a bangle.




2. Fill in R15A + TRUE2 + R15A between the other holes of the TIPPs, too. If you want to make a bangle without a clasp, join the beads through the holes of a TIPP.




3. Add FP3 + R11 + FP3 over every sequence of R15A + TRUE2 + R15A. Finish the step by exiting an R11.




4. Add TRUE2 + TILA + TRUE3 between the R11s. Turn back through the other hole of a TILA.




5. Fill in R15A + R15C +TRUE2 + R15C + R15A between the lower holes of the TILAs. The beads joining the TIPPs and the R11s will not be visible from the front side any more.



6. Return to the upper hole of the TILA and fill in TRUE2s between the TILAs and the R11s.



7. Fill in C11s between the TRUE2s added in the previous step.



8. Repeat steps nr. 3-7 on the other side of the bracelet.























9. Fill in TRUE2 + SD + TRUE2 between the R15As between the TILAs.




10. Go to the other side through an R15A + TRUE2 + SD (both holes), and fill in TRUE2s between the other holes of the SDs and the R15As next to the TILAs.

11. Exit a TILA and go through the following combination: R15A + R15C + TRUE2 + R15C. Add 3x R15B and go through the R15C + TRUE2 + R15B on the other side of the SD, in the opposite direction.

String through the TRUE2 between the R15A and the SD, and add 3x R15B.

Continue through the R15C + TRUE2 + R15A + TILA.



12. Add 3x R15Bs all around the bracelet.
